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### **U.S. News & World Report Names Peconic Landing among the Nation's 'High Performing Honors' for Ninth Consecutive Year**

GREENPORT, N.Y., December 10, 2019 — Peconic Landing at Southold, Inc. is proud to announce its designation as a *U.S. News & World Report* "Best Nursing Home" for the ninth consecutive year with a "High Performing" rating. Peconic Landing also received "High Performing" recognition under the "Short-Term" category for The Bluffs, Peconic Landing's resort-style short-term rehabilitation neighborhood.

According to U.S. News, the overall rating methodology assigns each eligible nursing home a rating from High Performing to Poor. This rating evaluates the care of a wide range of resident conditions and incorporates the nurse staffing, health inspection results, and quality measures. In addition to these measures, nursing homes were assessed on the appropriateness of the therapy minutes provided to their residents as well as the consistency of their reported nurse staffing across self-reported and payroll-based reporting systems.

Those earning the publication's top honor are the select few to have scored a five-star rating from the Centers of Medicare and Medicaid Services, the federal agency tasked with setting and enforcing standards for nursing homes. The agency evaluates federal data gauging health and safety standards, nurse staffing and care times, as well as the quality of care patients receive during a stay at each care center.

Last year, U.S. News introduced a new and first of its kind rating for Short-Stay Rehabilitation. This rating aims to provide patients with a clearer view of the quality of care provided by nursing homes to short-stay patients in need of intensive rehabilitation or nursing services before they return home after surgery, stroke, accident or illness. Out of nearly 13,000 nursing homes that were evaluated, less than 3,000 were recognized as U.S. News Best Nursing Homes. Peconic Landing is one of only 420 nursing homes to receive the designation for both short-term and long-term care.

The Shores, Peconic Landing's skilled nursing neighborhood, has maintained a five-star rating for the past nine years.
